rior to the start of morning assembly, our school's sound system plays the morning assembly song. A practice for slightly more than a decade, the same morning assembly song will be aired just before flag-raising for the whole of the academic year. A new song is selected at the beginning of the year, and for all of us in ACS(I), the end of the song marks the start to the school day.

Beyond being a marker to determine if one is punctual or late for school, the morning assembly song has become an endearing prelude that has grown on each cohort. It has become a tradition for the graduating cohort to play the four (for 'O' level graduates) or six (for IB graduates) morning assembly songs that they have listened to every morning, for the four or six years that they have spent as students in ACS(I) before they bid the school farewell.
